
## <u>Jesus raises Lazarus – miracle dice craft activity</u>


We did this activity earlier in the series. If you still have your first dice - great. If you have lost it or it has been squashed no problem - an extra template is included.


In this activity you will need:

- A4 pieces of thin card
- Pair of scissors
- Glue stick
- A plastic ruler (or straight edge)
- A clever mum or dad to help you with the cutting and to adapt the instructions if you need help.
- 1) Firstly, print out your dice net onto the thin card.

- Now carefully cut out the net shape, you might need mum or dad to help you with the tricky bits.
- 3)Now hold the edge of your ruler against each blue line and fold the card upwards.







4)Repeat this for the small green coloured folds.

- 5)Now, fold all the creases the opposite way so that your net starts to form a 3D shape.
- 6)Next, put some glue on the green side of the flaps attached to the square showing the bowl. Fold the bowl side up to meet the mat and bottle sides. Gently press the flaps to the inside of these sides.
- 7) Now, put some glue on the green side of the flaps attached to the square showing the fish and bread.
  Fold the fish and bread side up to meet the mat and bottle sides.
  Gently press the flaps to the inside of these sides.









8)Now, the really tricky bit. There are 3 green coloured flaps left. Put glue on all of these. Fold down the Lego man side into the box with the flaps inside. Gently press the cube together.



## Games you can play with your Miracle dice

We have looked at 12 miracles Jesus did so far in our series. Each of the dice faces shows a clue to the miracles.

Why not have a game with a friend. You throw the dice in turns and tell your friend about the miracles the dice lands on.

Imagine how the people in the story felt before Jesus did the miracle and how they felt after he did the miracle. Perhaps you could act out the scene.

You could also tell your friend what you learned about the miracle and why Jesus did it.
